Microsoft Teams Audio Conferencing

This morning you should have received an email from Microsoft Audio Conferencing saying that this feature has been turned off for Teams and Skype. This was an extra feature that Microsoft turned on back in March to assist with COVID-19 operations for six months. This only affects the ability for participants to phone in to Teams and Skype meetings. It does NOT affect participants using the Teams or Skype applications to connect. Nor does it affect Zoom. The bottom line is that if you have people that participate in Teams or Skype meetings by phone and cannot use the computer or mobile apps, you will have to switch to using Zoom which still supports phone in participants. CNAS ITS web site

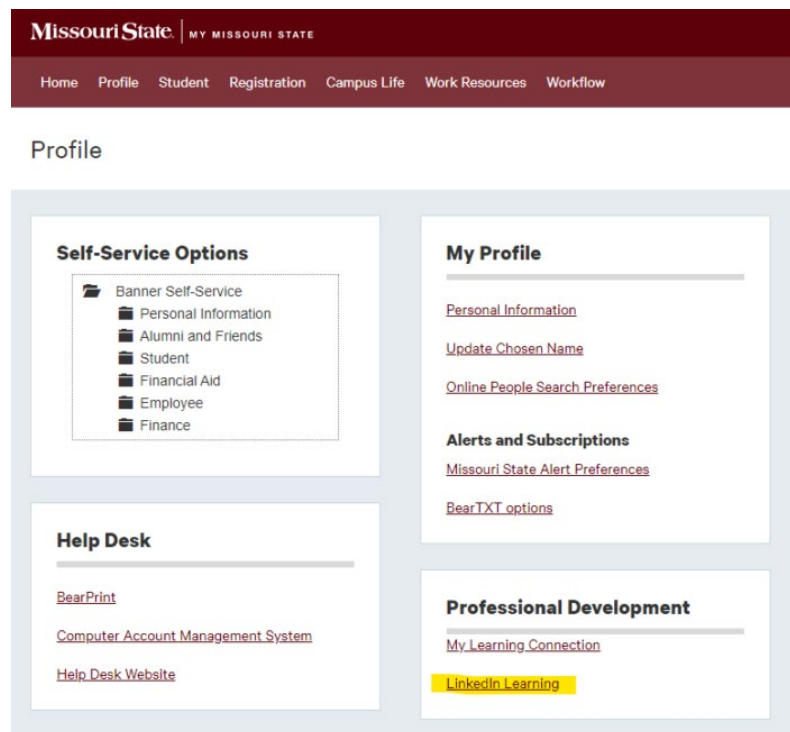

Microsoft Teams Training

LinkedIn Learning

As announced in Clif's Notes last week, faculty and staff now have access to training through LinkedIn Learning (LIL). It contains over 16,000 courses in topics ranging from technology, leadership, and business skills. There's even a course on "How to Use LinkedIn Learning". You access LIL through MyMSU. Zoom Recordings

If you are using Zoom to conduct synchronous classes online, you can record your Zoom sessions for later playback for students that were unable to attend live. Instructions for setting up recordings are in the [Help Desk Knowledge Base](#). One important note is that the processing of your recorded Zoom session may take up to 2 times the length of the session. So 1 hour, 15 minute class might take 2 hours, 30 minutes to process and become available to you to download. The best place to store these recordings is in Microsoft Stream. In addition to storing and streaming your videos, it will also create captions to make your recording meet accessibility standards. Once you upload your Zoom recording to Stream it will process the video and add closed captions. This will also take time. There is no published estimate for how this will take.
