

This graduate certificate is designed for current hospitality managers wishing to further their education and knowledge in the field and for career-changers desiring to pursue a management career in the hospitality industry. It may be completed as a stand-alone graduate certificate or in conjunction with a master's degree.



Estimated Costs for the Hospitality Administration Graduate Certificate

The direct teaching costs for this graduate certificate have already been anticipated and budgeted for. The Department Head will teach one or two of the courses, and the others have already been included in the future teaching load for Melissa Dallas.

This is not projected to change over the next five years.

The Hospitality Administration Certificate Program is a 12-hour program that includes one three-hour field experience course in addition to nine hours of online study. It is designed to prepare graduates for mid to upper-level management positions in the hospitality industry.
