We added one course to the required core, removed one course from the core (GRY 498), and increased the credit hours of the field study requirement from 2 to 3 credit hours to reflect the actual time commitment and content of our public affairs capstone course (GRY 353 and GRY 470).

10/24/2016 - Department Head Review - Toby Dogwiler - As described above, this proposal will delete the options currently included in the Geography BS degree program, as well as, modify the remaining core requirements. As such, the Cultural and Regional, Environmental and Natural Resources, and Geotourism options will be deleted and the program title will simply become "Geography". I fully support this effort by the Geography faculty to simplify and streamline the requirements of the degree program.

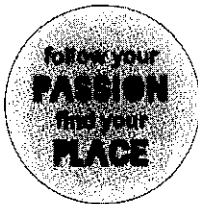

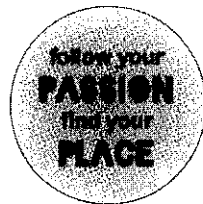

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**POLICY STATEMENT**  
**Math 107: Contemporary Mathematics Co-requisite**

**Corequisite:** Concurrent enrollment in MTH 130.

**Course Description:**

The primary objective of the co-requisite course is to support student success in MTH 130. Strategies for success and mathematical skills will be emphasized to reinforce the content of MTH 130. Lab activities will solidify understanding of problem solving, geometry, probability, statistics, and personal finance.

**Course Objectives:** The following objectives will be developed:

1. Use appropriate student strategies to improve success in MTH 130 – such as good attendance, good work ethic, asking for help, productive study techniques, and so on.
2. Apply traditional and contemporary mathematical concepts to solve everyday problems
3. Use appropriate technology to explore or compute answers.
4. Interpret results of any computation in terms of the problem.
5. Communicate effectively in a written manner regarding the mathematics studied.
6. Select and utilize appropriate representations for mathematical problems.

**Required Materials:** Students are responsible for having the following materials available for use in this course:

1. MyMathLab access for the student's section of MTH 130 .
2. MTH 130 Course text: *Mathematical Ideas*, 13<sup>th</sup> edition, by Miller, Heeren V., Hornsby, and Heeren, C. ISBN: 978-0-321-97707-6.
3. A scientific calculator.
4. Geogebra. This is a free software that allows students to make geometric drawings, graph algebraic equations (a feature we will probably not use), or to plot and analyze basic statistical data. This software can be downloaded by going to: <http://www.geogebra.org/>.

**Attendance:** Due to the nature of this course, attendance to each class is critical. *Within the first two weeks of class, any student that misses two consecutive class periods with no notification to the instructor will be dropped from the class.*

**Evaluation and Grading:** The course grade will be calculated based on completion of work during the Co-requisite class time. Each week, students will evaluate their use of strategies to be successful as a student and look for ways to improve. Mathematical activities to build skills and concepts will be conducted during the class period and student work will be graded as to how well it meets the objectives of the activity.

Grades will be assigned to a student's overall percent score in the class using the following scale: (plus or minus grades are not assigned)

90 to 100%	80 to 89%	70 to 79%	60 to 69%	59% or lower
A	B	C	D	F

**NOTE:** To ensure the assessment of the co-requisite is consistent with the primary objective, students who receive a failing grade in MTH 130 will be assigned the same for the MTH 107.

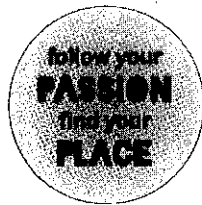

### Community and Regional Planning Graduate Certificate

#### Program description

This certificate program is designed to provide graduate-level education in Community and Regional. It is anticipated that this program would be attractive to students in other MSU graduate programs in the sciences and social sciences as well as working professionals. Planning concepts and theory are especially useful for students pursuing degrees in Public Administration, Political Science, and Geospatial Sciences. The Community and Regional Planning certificate program emphasizes concepts and theories surrounding land use assessment, urban design, neighborhood planning, transportation planning, and tourism and planning and development.

#### Completion requirements

Students must have an overall grade point average of 3.00 for completion of the certificate program.

#### Admission criteria

The Community and Regional Planning Certificate program is open to all persons holding a BS, BA, MS, or PhD degree. Students must, of course, satisfy all prerequisites for any courses they take in the program; or they must obtain instructor approval to waive specific prerequisites. Once admitted to the program, the student must take a minimum of four courses as designated and approved by the program coordinator and must have an average cumulative grade point average of 3.00 or better to receive the certificate.
